Dear Rice Raven Band Parent,

I am pleased to welcome your child as a member of the Rice Wind Ensemble for the 2022-2023 school year! This invitation is based on your child's performance ability as demonstrated in a live audition as well as a summary evaluation of his/her contributions to the band during the 2021-2022 school year.

The Wind Ensemble is the flagship of the Rice Band Program. As such, Wind Ensemble students participate in a number of unique events. In the past, these have including world premiere performances of commissioned works by world-renown composers and performances in major symphonic venues, such as the Meyerson Symphony Center in Dallas, the Eisemann Center in Richardson, and the Murchison Performing Arts Center in Denton.

The Wind Ensemble performs literature of a difficulty generally associated with fine high school programs in the United States. Although the focus of the curriculum is musical growth and artistic expression, the Wind Ensemble is also a competitive organization, entering local, state, and national competitions as well as the TMEA Honor Band selection process. This is a testament to the diligence and hard work of both the directors and students in the band.

With additional privilege comes added responsibility. It is important for students in the Wind Ensemble to recognize that, while there is a place for every student in the Rice Band, the Wind Ensemble is reserved for young musicians with the highest level of commitment to the success of our band organization.

Students who will be new to the Wind Ensemble must realize that their selection to this band is not the end of a process, but rather the beginning. Many months of hard work and great musical rewards lie ahead. With quality instruction and hard work, they will be amazed at the potential they can realize.

Students who are returning to the Wind Ensemble are not going to be repeating the same experience they had as seventh graders. Rather, they must now assume their crucial role as leaders in the band. Their experience will be invaluable to the incoming members of the band.

We are still working on finalizing our calendar for 2022-2023. However, please note the following *tentative* special events for Wind Ensemble students next year:

- Saturday, November 12th—All-Region Band Phase 1 Auditions at Willow Springs MS
- Monday, November 14th—All-Region Band Phase 2 Auditions at Willow Springs MS
- Friday & Saturday, November 9th and 10th—All-Region Clinic/Concert at Melissa HS
- Friday, March 24th—Probable UIL Performance at Plano West Senior High
- Thursday through Saturday, April 27-29—Dallas Winds Invitational at the Meyerson

As was previously mentioned, there are a number of responsibilities that accompany membership in the Wind Ensemble. Students in the Wind Ensemble are expected to fulfill all of the following requirements:

- Attend <u>all scheduled curricular and extracurricular band functions</u>, unless prohibited by excusable circumstances (illness, death in family, etc.) or participation in an overriding <u>school</u> function (does <u>not</u> include non-school activities) cleared in advance by Mr. Tucker. Other than social activities, all band events are required for Wind Ensemble.
- Promptly attend all section rehearsals and scheduled clinics throughout the year
- Maintain academic eligibility throughout the year
- Prepare all assigned music
- Complete all assignments in full and on time
- Represent the band program positively through peer interactions and encourage members of other bands.
- Make every effort to be present in class every day, notifying Mr. Tucker by phone or email in advance of any absence. Absences are highly detrimental to an interdependent group. We do not want sick students in class, but please avoid scheduling any flexible appointments during your band rehearsal (ie. orthodontist) if at all possible. It is impossible to make up what is missed in a rehearsal.

Because of the elevated importance of the individual in the level of literature performed in the Wind Ensemble, it is crucial that every student in the organization accept his or her commitment and responsibilities as a member of this band. Consequently, any student who is unable or unwilling to fulfill the requirements of Wind Ensemble needs to let Mr. Tucker know prior to the summer break. Every student has a place in the Rice Band, but placement in the varsity ensemble requires additional commitment.

Attached you will find a listing of materials that will be required for the 2022-2023 school year. An updated calendar will be provided at the beginning of the school year with all available event information. In the meantime, we will try to keep our website calendar updated with as many dates as possible over the summer.

If you are interested in something very fun and band-related over the summer, we highly recommend you attend a summer band camp or check out a performance by members of Drum Corps International. Words cannot describe the music and pageantry of these "extreme marching band" groups that tour and compete across the United States each year. Two of their regional performances are here in the DFW area:

- DCI Denton is on July 21st in Denton
- DCI McKinney is on July 26th in McKinney

Required Materials for Wind Ensemble

All students in the Wind Ensemble will need to have the following items prior to the first day of school:

- All students will need a heavy-duty black 1½" 3-ring binder. This will be a concert binder, so it needs to be solid black when facing the audience.
- All students will need 8 tabbed dividers for their binder. We will label these during the first week of school.
- Marching Band Flip-Folder (May be purchased through the band)
- Marching Band Lyre or Folding Music Stand (depends on instrument)
- Personal Digital Tuner* with Clip-On Pick-Up Microphone. (excluding percussionists)
- Metronome* (with subdivision)
- Pencil and Highlighter
- Trumpets and trombones should have an <u>aluminum</u> straight mute.
 - Trumpets-Dennis Wick is preferred, Tom Crown is an alternate
 - o Trombones-Tom Crown is preferred, Dennis Wick is an alternate

^{*}The Korg TM-50 Tuner/Metronome Combo is highly recommended for all woodwind and brass players, since it contains both the metronome and tuner in a user-friendly package. Please put your name on your tuner. They all look identical.

Approved Step-Up Instruments

Many Wind Ensemble students find that their beginning-level instruments no longer meet their needs as advancing musicians. The following instruments are approved for use in the PWSH cluster and will last your child beyond high school. Please visit with Mr. Tucker before substituting any listed instrument, as there are many special considerations unique to step-up instruments.

Flute

- Miyazawa 102 series or above
- Yamaha YFL-577H
- Visit Carolyn Nussbaum's shop for additional options.

Clarinet

- Yamaha YCL-CSVR with Vandoren M-15 mouthpiece and Vandoren M/O inverted ligature.
- Buffet R-13 with Vandoren M-15 mouthpiece and Vandoren M/O inverted ligature.

Alto Saxophone

- Yamaha YAS-875EX Custom with Vandoren AL3 mouthpiece and Vandoren M/O ligature.
- Selmer Super Action 80 with Vandoren AL3 mouthpiece and Vandoren M/O ligature.

Trumpet

- Bach Stradavarius 180-37 with Bach 5C mouthpiece
- Yamaha YTR-8335S Xeno with Bach 5C mouthpiece
- Bach Artisan AB190S with Bach 5C mouthpiece

Trombone

- Bach Stradavarius 42BO, 42T, or 42A with Bach 5G mouthpiece
- Conn 88HO with Bach 5G mouthpiece
- Yamaha YSL-8820 with Bach 5G mouthpiece
- Bach Artisan A47I with Bach 5G mouthpiece

Euphonium

- We recommend you upgrade your mouthpiece to a Schilke 51D if you do not own one.
- Contact Mr. Tucker if you are interested in purchasing your own instrument.

<u>Tuba</u>

- We recommend you upgrade your mouthpiece to a Perantucci PT-36 if you do not own one.
- Contact Mr. Tucker if you are interested in purchasing your own instrument.

Percussion

Oboe, Bassoon, French Horn
